South Wales Police Authority has set the 2010/11 budget as £257.3 Million – an increase of 3.5%.

The police element of council tax has increased by 5% – or £7.32 per year for a Band D household. This means the total amount a Band D household pays is £153.67, or 42p per day for a 24 hour, seven days a week police service.

Why have we increased the budget?

Setting the budget is always tough, and a question of balance. We asked for the public's views, and of nearly 1300 people who took part, there was a wide difference in opinion as to how much extra council tax should be asked for. Of those who answered, 43% felt that it should be between 2% and 4%, with 37% of people supporting an increase of 5% and over.

We also look to make efficiency savings each year, to ensure that we provide value for money and continue good service. Our achieved and projected cashable efficiencies since 2000 to 2011/12 amounts to some £35m.

Our forecasted General Reserve of 1.72% of budget is well below the 3% recommendation by the Wales Audit Office.

Safer South Wales

Despite these pressures, we continue to work hard to keep South Wales safe. The total number of crimes recorded from April 2009 to January 2010 fell by 11,656 – which means there were 38 fewer victims of crime every day. As well as this, confidence in your local police has increased by nearly 8% in six months – from 39% to 46.9%, which is the biggest increase of any force in Wales and England. These performance figures show that crime is going down, whilst confidence in the police is going up.

The Authority and Force are proud of the continuing decrease in crime levels, and will work together with our communities and partners to make sure that this is maintained.

Mae elfen yr heddlu o'r dreth gyngor wedi cynyddu gan 5% – neu £7.32 y flwyddyn ar gyfer cartref Band D. Golyga hyn mai'r cyfanswm y bydd cartref Band D yn ei dalu fydd £153.67, neu 42p y dydd am wasanaeth heddlu 24 awr y dydd, saith diwrnod yr wythnos.

Pam ein bod wedi cynyddu'r gyllideb?

Mae pennu'r gyllideb bob amser yn gwestiwn anodd ac mae'n fater o gydbwys. Gofynnwm am farn y cyhoedd, ac o'r bron i 1300 o bobl a gymerodd ran, roedd amrywiaeth barn eang ynglŷn â faint yn ychwanegol o dreth gyngor y dylid gofyn amdani. O'r rheiny a atebodd, teimlai 43% y dylai'r swm fod rhwng 2% a 4%, gyda 37% o'r bobl yn cefnogi cynnydd gan 5% a mwya.

Rydym hefyd yn ceisio gwneud arbedion effeithlonrwydd bob blwyddyn, er mwyn sicrhau ein bod yn rhoi gwerth am arian ac yn parhau i gynnig gwasanaeth da. Mae ein heffeithlonrwydd ariannol a gyflawnwyd ac a ragamcannir rhwng 2000 a 2011/12 yn dod i gyfanswm o tua £35 miliwn.



De Cymru Ddiogelach

Er y pwysau yma, rydym yn parhau i weithio'n galed i gadw De Cymru'n ddiogel. Mae cyfanswm nifer y troseddau a gofnodwyd rhwng Ebrill 2009 ac Ionawr 2010 wedi gostwng gan 11,656 – sy'n golygu 38 yn llai o ddioddefwyr trosedd bob dydd. Yn ogystal â hyn, mae'r hyder yn eich heddlu lleol wedi cynyddu gan bron i 8% mewn chwe mis – o 39% i 46.9%, y cynnydd mwyaf gan unrhyw lu yng Nghymru a Lloegr. Mae'r ffugrau perfformiad hyn yn dangos bod nifer troseddau yn gostwng tra bod hyder yn yr heddlu yn cynyddu.

Mae'r Awdurdod a'r Llu yn falch o'r gostyngiad parhaus mewn lefelau trosedd, a byddant yn gweithio gyda'n cymunedau a'n partneriaid i wneud yn siŵr bod hyn yn cael ei gynnal.

The Capital programme budget for 2010/11 is £16.3 million. Funding is made available from Home Office capital grant £3.0 million and external borrowing of £2.2 million.

As at March 2009, the general reserves held was £3.7 million. As at March 2010, the reserve shall be £4.9 million.

Y gyllideb rhaglen Gyfalaf ar gyfer 2010/11 yw £16.3 miliwn. Rhoddir ariannu ar gael drwy grant cyfalaf y Swyddfa Gartref gwerth £3.0 miliwn a benthyciadau allanol gwerth £2.2 miliwn.

Ym mis Mawrth 2009, y gronfa wrth gefn oedd £3.7 miliwn. Ym mis Mawrth 2010, y gronfa wrth gefn fydd £4.9 miliwn.
