Ms Pickles updated that she and ACC Holland are currently working on this and will have a draft ready next week. Ms Pickles outlined a meeting attended with the NSPCC, There are currently 2 models proposed. MASH and Hubs, there is a structure change at the moment, there is a need for a robust joint review. Ms Pickles will now meet with all Heads of Children's Services separately. Ms Pickles updated on discussions with New Pathways – there has been 2 people employed by Comic Relief who provide debriefs. Ms Pickles stated that the current infrastructure is not robust enough. Mr Vaughan explained that once the information is in our system, we have the ability to track, however not everyone who is vulnerable will come to the Police for help but other organisations. Mr Rose explained he is looking into systems that speak with young people, to start talking about these issues and to find out if these conversations are taking place and if so how they are then reported and dealt with. 	areas such as Health, where projects who have			
	projects on IT in different silo's being joined

	Mr Jukes outlined the operational perspective.			
	Discussions took place around the strategic			
	assessment from last year.			
	Mr Jukes noted that the absence of evidence does			
	not mean this issue isn't happening. Vulnerable			
	people will not always be picked up by police data;			
	we need to close this gap.			
	Mr Jukes updated that there are 7000 missing			
	persons reported in South Wales per year, looking			
	into breaking down this data, also trying to gather			
	proxy data.			
	Mr Jukes outlined the Crime and Safeguarding			
	Board and the need to amalgamate these			
	conversations into our structures.			
	Mr Michael stated currently arranging meetings with			
	Head of Children's Services, will discuss these			
	issues with them.

	Mr Michael stated we need to ensure the policing			
	and partnership is right then the communication			
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	with the wider public. Ms Pickles, Mr Jukes and Ms Holland to take forward. Mr Vaughan stated we need a single line of sight and clear structures so everyone is clear on what their responsibilities are. Clear mechanisms and structure enhance our Force. 02.10.14.2b	Mr Lewis explained the size and scale figures speak for themselves. It was the biggest event of its type in the UK. Two very different forces working excellent together this is testament to Chris Armitt who brought the forces together. There were 60 World Leaders, 160 people who attracted armed protection under the Vienna Convention, which was higher than the Olympics where 121 people required armed protection and 2000 journalists were also in attendance. Mr Lewis outlined President Obamas visit and commended the excellent work of Superintendent Stewart Parfitt and Chief Inspector Mark Hobrough who worked closely with the American Secret Service. There were 8000 Mutual Aid officers from outside Forces (not Gwent or SWP), 1100 police officers from South Wales working 10 ½ thousand shifts and 450 police officers from Gwent working 4 ½ thousand shifts. Peak deployment was 3 rd September 80,000 shifts, 8000 officers deployed in 24 hours. Over 100 different specialisms deployed. 150,000 hot meals delivered, 2.5km of fencing, 1.2km of fencing in Cardiff Bay. 5 Destroyers in Cardiff Bay, The PSU Bike Team was a big		

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	success.	
	31 Prisoners associated to the NATO Event, for	
	relatively minor offences, which is an indication of	
	the good intelligence. There was a bomb hoax; the	
	perpetrators were caught whilst still on the	
	telephone.	
	There was a significant impact on the force during	
	and post NATO, people are still returning to work	
	after NATO.	
	Mr Lewis explained debrief has been carried out,	
	Nationally the service has been tested; we need to	
	ensure the Government understands the impact of	
	these events during austerity.	
	Positive feedback from Police staff and our	
	volunteers, many stating they would like the	
	opportunity to do more roles like this.	
	Public response has been very positive, we can be	
	rightly proud of a very successful event.	
	Mr Vaughan explained he is very proud in how we	
	dealt with NATO and how we got the resources	
	right from South Wales Police.	
	Mr Michael stated the volunteers from my team	
	came back full of enthusiasm. The plea which Mr	
	Vaughan gave to other forces to follow the South	
	Wales Police model worked well. There was	
	decisive action when requires and partnership	
	working with Gwent and other forces was excellent.

Mr Jukes explained there has been a really constructive experience in bringing the evidence together, the perspective of both the Government and Policing, based on evidence there are some very specific vulnerable needs that we need to address. It was stated that Detective Superintendent Lian Penhale who has joined the PPU department a few weeks ago, stepped up and we were pleased that she was able to comment. Ms Carr stated that we have had a very positive	
		response from the committee. Mr Michael explained the fact that it came across so well is testament.

2.10.14.7	Commissioner and Chief Constable meetings with Local Authority Leaders and Chief Executives	Mr Michael stated that the Chief Officer presence at these meetings is invaluable; we are now achieving much more with these meetings. We need to become clearer about what we want from the Local Authorities. Through Mr Lewis we need to get a feeling from the BCU's about what we need to reinforce. Mr Jukes added territorial policing needs to be clear on what the Local Authorities needs and we will be able to project onto these our own priorities. Mr Michael added we need to work with Local Authorities around the youth service and look at how can we get more out of what we have, need to find a strategy for working with young people. Mr Rose stated that there are critical times ahead for example A Level results and Bonfire Night when young people are on the street and outlined strategies. Mr Vaughan added that the reason why the riots that occurred in England did not occur in Cardiff was because of the early intervention of youth workers. South Wales has the right engagement. Ms Pickles outlined a safeguarding issue around		

		recruitment issues with social workers, the threshold has increased they cannot keep staff due to the risk levels.
